- The Institute for Transportation Coordination is an intensive training and planning forum
 created to enhance the capacity of communities to provide cost-effective and customerfocused transportation services by coordinating funding, information, services, and
 equipment.
- The Institute is designed to support specific communities in promoting the delivery of coordinated human services transportation to all individuals with disabilities, people with limited incomes, older adults, youth, and others.
- The three-and-a-half-day forum will promote active and open collaboration within and across community teams that come to the Institute with a commitment to ensuring that those who are transportation disadvantaged can access health care, education, recreation, employment, and other life-sustaining activities.
- At the Institute, faculty who have acquired knowledge and experience in coordinating transportation will share workable strategies and practical tools with community teams.
 Community teams will have the opportunity to determine a course of action that fits their specific current and future transportation needs and to network with other teams.
- Community teams will have the opportunity to learn about coordination models, explore
 promising local coordination practices, and discuss effective community outreach and
 partnership-building strategies. Attention will also focus on leveraging federal dollars
 and maximizing relationships with local agencies administering federal programs.
